

Resolution 5

Sponsors: Bosnia-Herzegovina, China, Saudi Arabia, Argentina, Slovenia, UK, North Korea, Mauritius, Senegal, South Korea

Signatories: Bolivia, Indonesia, Slovakia, Mexico, France, Cuba, Burkina Faso, Brazil, Netherlands, Djibouti, Cameroon

Topic: Discrimination of indigenous peoples

Remembering that in China, Mauritius, Saudi Arabia, Slovenia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, UK, Korea, and Argentina, the women, children, and indigenous people are very discriminated against.

Realizing that for example, in Saudi Arabia, the women only represent 5% of the working population, there is child prostitution in Mauritius, and in Slovenia there are problems with healthcare and education. Additionally, in other cities, the indigenous people are very discriminated against;

- 1) Encourages the UN to work with open and open an Anti-Discrimination Center to help the women, children, and indigenous people
- 2) Urges member countries to follow the goals of the resolution, to put one Anti-Discrimination Center in each country, to help the people there that are discriminated against
- 3) Requests that all nations help the discriminated people. For example, children in the centers can have a good childhood, women in the centers can work and be treated fairly like men are treated, and indigenous people can be educated

Create the development of a United Nations Emergency Fund that encouraged donations to make money for these centers.
